

TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS – 24 THE PLANET

General Terms and Conditions for Services and Execution of Activities - STICHTING THE GREATER GOOD (also known as 24 The Planet), based in Amsterdam and registered with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce (KvK) under number 90597419. The organisation is located at Uiterbuurtweg 37 in Nieuwveen (2441 EA). Hereinafter referred to as STICHTING THE GREATER GOOD.

ARTICLE 1: DEFINITIONS 1.1. In these terms and conditions, the following definitions apply:

1. **Event:** The sports events organised annually by STICHTING THE GREATER GOOD under the name 24 The Planet.
2. **Participant:** The individual who has registered for the Event in a manner approved by the Organiser.
3. **Agreement:** The agreement between the Participant and the Organiser regarding participation in the Event.
4. **Organiser/Organisation:** The legal entity STICHTING THE GREATER GOOD with whom the Participant has entered into an Agreement. 1.2. These general terms and conditions apply to every Agreement.

ARTICLE 2: REGISTRATION AND PARTICIPATION

2.1. The Participant must be at least 18 years old in the year the Event takes place.

2.2. The Participant may only participate if they have completed the registration form truthfully, paid the registration fee in full at least one day before the Event, and agreed to these terms and conditions.

2.3. Upon registration (at the latest on the day of the Event), the Participant will receive a race number allowing them to take part.

2.4. The Participant may modify their registration after submission. Any associated costs will be borne by the Participant.

2.5. Participation is strictly personal. It is not permitted to transfer participation to another person.

ARTICLE 3: CANCELLATION

3.1. Transferring a race number to another person is not allowed.

3.2. Money raised by the Participant for the Event's charitable cause will still be donated in the event of cancellation.

3.3. The Organiser may cancel the Event due to exceptional circumstances (force majeure).

3.4. In the event of cancellation by the Organiser, no liability exists for reimbursement of expenses incurred by the Participant.

3.5. Any money raised by the Participant for charity will still be donated if the Event is cancelled by the Organiser.

3.6. The Organiser will inform Participants whether a rescheduled date within the same calendar year is feasible.

ARTICLE 4: LIABILITY

4.1. Participation is at the Participant's own risk. The Participant must follow the Organiser's instructions. Any damage resulting from failure to do so remains the responsibility of the injured party. If a third party suffers damage due to a Participant's failure to follow instructions, that Participant is liable.

4.2. The Organisation is only liable for damage caused by acts or omissions of its members, representatives, or those acting on its behalf.

4.3. Claims must be reported to the Organisation immediately.

4.4. The Organisation is not liable for damages caused by extreme weather conditions (e.g., heat, cold, thunderstorms, or storms). Participants are advised to prepare accordingly.

4.5. There will be no on-site medical assistance. The Organisation is not responsible for medical aid. Participants must arrange this themselves.

4.6. The Organisation is not liable for injuries, exhaustion, dehydration, or other health issues arising from the Event.

4.7. The Participant must have adequate insurance covering risks related to injury, illness, or death due to participation.

4.8. The Participant must also have liability insurance.

4.9. The Participant confirms they are in good mental and physical health and have trained adequately for the Event.

4.10. The Organisation is not liable for loss, damage, or theft of personal belongings.

4.11. The Organisation is not liable for injuries or damages caused by other Participants or third parties. 4.12. Participants are responsible for their own nutrition and hydration. The Organisation is not liable for allergies or health issues arising from provided food or drinks. 4.13. Costs for search and rescue operations due to failure to check out with the Organisation will be charged to the Participant.

ARTICLE 5: IMAGE RIGHTS

5.1. The Participant grants the Organiser permission in advance to capture, use, and publish photos, videos, and other images in which they appear. These may be used for promotional purposes, including websites, social media, printed materials, and other communication channels.

5.2. The Participant is not entitled to any compensation for the use of such images.

ARTICLE 6: PERSONAL DATA

6.1. Personal data provided by the Participant will be stored and processed in accordance with applicable privacy laws, including the UK GDPR.

6.2. Personal data will only be used for Event organisation purposes, such as registration, communication, safety measures, and statistical analysis.

6.3. Participants have the right to access, correct, delete, or transfer their personal data. Requests should be submitted to the Organiser, who will respond within 14 days.

6.4. Personal data necessary for participation will not be kept longer than required and will be deleted within the legally permitted timeframe after the Event.

6.5. The Organiser will not share personal data with third parties unless necessary for the Event or required by law.

ARTICLE 7: TRAFFIC RULES

7.1. Local laws and regulations, including traffic laws, apply. Participants must follow instructions from marshals and police officers and remain aware of traffic.

7.2. The Organisation may withdraw Participants from the Event if they deem it unsafe to continue.

7.3. Littering is only allowed in designated bins. Local regulations apply.

7.4. If a Participant withdraws from the Event, they must inform the Organisation immediately. If they fail to do so and a search and rescue operation is initiated, the costs may be charged to the Participant.

7.5. The Organisation reserves the right to modify regulations, routes, and locations.

ARTICLE 8: BRAND PROTECTION AND COPYRIGHT

8.1. The names, logos, branding, and trademarks of 24 The Planet and STICHTING THE GREATER GOOD are protected by copyright and trademark laws.

8.2. Participants and third parties are prohibited from using these names, logos, or any related intellectual property without prior written consent from the Organiser.

8.3. Any unauthorised use, reproduction, or distribution of copyrighted material related to the Event is strictly prohibited and may result in legal action.

8.4. The Organiser reserves the right to take appropriate legal measures against any infringement of intellectual property rights.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

This is the privacy statement of The Greater Good Foundation (“The Greater Good”), organizer of the 24 The Planet event (“Event”).

We process your personal data in accordance with applicable data protection regulations, including the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). This privacy statement explains which personal data we collect for what purposes and on what legal basis.

We may adjust this privacy statement from time to time. The latest adjustment was made on [August 4, 2023]. You can always view the latest version via the hyperlink [Privacy & Cookies] on the website. You can print and/or save the privacy statement using the designated button at the top of the page.

Data Controller

The Greater Good organizes the Event to raise money for Justdiggit, which aims to combat climate change by greening Africa. The Greater Good is the data controller within the meaning of the GDPR for processing personal data in the context of the Event, as described below.

Purposes of Processing Personal Data

Participation in the Event

When you want to participate in the Event, you create an account on the website www.24theplanet.com (“Website”). Your email address, telephone number, address, and date of birth are used to process your registration, allow you to participate in the Event, and inform you in the run-up to the Event. The emergency number is only used to inform in case of an emergency. The legal basis is the execution of the participation agreement.

Sponsoring

The Greater Good processes data such as name, email address, and payment details to execute the donation and send you a donation receipt. Via the participant’s personal page, you can also request to donate directly and thus make a donation anonymously. The legal basis is the execution of the agreement.

If you sponsor a particular participant, your name and donation will be provided to the participant. The legal basis for this is the execution of the agreement. You can also choose to sponsor anonymously.

You can draft a personal message posted on the personal page of the participant you sponsor. The legal basis for this is the execution of the agreement.

If you want your name and donation to be mentioned on the personal page of the participant you sponsor, you can indicate this. The legal basis for this is consent.

Information and Newsletter

The Greater Good keeps sponsors informed about the Event via email unless you have indicated that you do not appreciate this. The legal basis for this is the legitimate marketing interest of The Greater Good.

If you want to receive more information from Justdiggit, you can sign up for Justdiggit’s newsletter. The legal basis for this is consent.

Website Security and Improvement

The Greater Good uses cookies and techniques similar to cookies. We do this, among other things, to secure the Website and improve the Website. The legal basis for using personal data obtained through cookies and similar techniques is your consent (except for functional cookies and cookies with minor consequences for your privacy). For more information, see the Cookie Statement. You can always withdraw your consent.

Social Media

You can choose to share certain information on social media. The legal basis for this is the execution of the agreement.

Your Rights

You have the right to request us to exercise your rights with regard to your personal data. You can direct the following requests to us by contacting us by email at info@24theplanet.com.

Access

You can request The Greater Good to inform you about which personal data is being processed, for what purpose, shared with which third parties/partners, the applicable retention periods, the source from which personal data may have been collected from someone other than the data subject, and information about any automated decision-making.

Correction

You can request The Greater Good to correct or supplement your personal data if this data is factually incorrect or incomplete.

Erasure

You can request The Greater Good to delete your personal data when the personal data is irrelevant for the purpose for which it was collected, when consent has been withdrawn, when you object to a processing of personal data based on a legitimate interest, or when the processing of personal data is unlawful.

Restriction of Processing

You can request The Greater Good to limit the processing of your personal data by temporarily storing them and not processing them further when the accuracy of the personal data is disputed, the processing of personal data is unlawful, but you do not wish deletion or if you are waiting for the response to a request to exercise the right to object.

Object

You can object to The Greater Good in those cases where data processing is based on the pursuit of the legitimate interest of The Greater Good or a third party. The emails we send you via email service and other marketing information sent by us also include an opt-out option. If you use this, you will no longer receive such messages.

Data Portability

You can request The Greater Good to obtain your own personal data in a structured, commonly used, and machine-readable form and transfer it to another organization when data processing is automated and based on consent or an agreement.

Withdrawal of Consent

You can request The Greater Good to withdraw a once-given consent.

Complaint to the Supervisory Authority

You can file a complaint with the Personal Data Authority if you believe that The Greater Good infringes on protecting your personal data.

Security

We have taken appropriate technical and organizational measures to protect your personal data against loss or any form of unlawful processing. For example, data connections are secured and The Greater Good uses access control.

Provision to Third Parties

The Greater Good may use the services of third parties to process your data in accordance with this Privacy Statement. These third parties act as a processor for The Greater Good and we ensure that these parties provide sufficient guarantees regarding the security measures and careful and lawful processing of personal data.

When you make a donation, the payment details will be processed by the payment service provider Mollie.

Otherwise, The Greater Good only provides data to third parties with your prior consent or if we are obliged to do so under laws and regulations, if we are compelled to do so as a result of a lawsuit and/or if we deem it necessary to protect our own interests or the interests of third parties.

Transfer Outside Europe

Your personal data will only be stored or processed outside the European Union (and the EEA) by The Greater Good or third parties engaged by The Greater Good if this is in accordance with the applicable regulations for the transfer of personal data to countries outside the European Union. This means that we will only transfer your personal data to countries outside the European Union if the European Commission has decided that the relevant third country guarantees an adequate level of protection, or if other appropriate safeguards are provided, such as an adequacy decision (for example, the EU-US Privacy Shield) or the use of unaltered standard data protection clauses approved by the European Commission. Retention Periods

Personal data may not be stored longer than necessary. The determination of the retention period depends on the purpose for which The Greater Good has collected the data and any legal obligations to retain data.
